





#### ORDER

- 2.As per paper read 2nd above, The Principal has remitted ₹10000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only) being affiliation fee online vide chalan no. 171904980 dated 17.10.2017 and requested to grant additional affiliation to M.A English (15) programme for the academic year 2017-18. The Principal has also forwarded a notarised undertaking duly signed by the Principal and the Manager of the institution for the above purpose, vide paper read as 3rd above.
- 3. Considering the case in detail, the Honourable Vice Chancellor, as per paper read as 4th above, has accorded sanction for granting additional affiliation to M.A English (15) programme for the academic year 2017-18 at Little flower institute of Social Sciences And Health (LISSAH) [Unaided], Kaithapoyil, Kozhikode.
- 4. Additional affiliation is therefore granted to M.A English (15) self financing programme for the academic year 2017-18 at Little flower Institute of Social Sciences And Health(LISSAH) [Unaided], Kaithapoyil, Kozhikode, subject to the conditions mentioned herein:
- 5. Selection and admission shall be made only on the basis of rules and regulations of University/Government and on the basis of the directions issued by University/Government from time to time failing which affiliation granted will automatically be cancelled.
- 6. In the light of the directions of the Supreme Court of India in WP(C) 656/1998, the institution shall take stringent measures for the prevention of ragging in any form. In case of failure to prevent such instances of ragging, appropriate action including withdrawal of affiliation of the college will be initiated.
- 7. The Principal shall contact the Directorate of Admissions for further proceedings with regard to admission procedure for the programme at the earliest.

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- 8. The Principal has to report the starting of classes after completing the admission procedure, to College Development Council accordingly.
- 9. Affiliation granted is strictly provisional and only for the academic year 2017-18. The college has to apply for continuation of provisional affiliation to the programme for the ensuing years remitting the fee fixed by University from time to time.
- 10. The list of colleges which have renewed provisional affiliation or applied for continuation of provisional affiliation will be forwarded to the Office of the Controller of Examinations to ensure that examinations are not conducted in those colleges which have not applied for the same.
- 11.The conduct of University Examinations of any sort including that of SDE examinations is compulsory and binding on all colleges affiliated to the University of Calicut.
- 12. Admission to the next academic year shall be made only after obtaining prior permission from the University.

### Managements of colleges shall execute an agreement with Government as per the conditions below:

- The Educational Agency shall agree to give an Undertaking to the University about the presence of adequate infrastructure for conducting the course and the presence of adequate NET qualified faculty.
- 2. The Educational Agency shall agree to abide by the procedure of admission as decided by the Government and set apart 50% of the seats of the course for being filled up by the Government or such authority determined by Government on the basis of merit and reservation principles followed by the Government and the remaining 50% to be filled up by the Educational Agency on the basis of merit.
- The Educational Agency will agree to collect only such fees as determined by the Government from time to time from the students admitted to the college for the course.
- 4. The Educational Agency will agree to institute adequate number of scholarships on merit-cum-means basis as determined by the Government from time to time to the methods to desire the course. merit-cum-means basis as dete students admitted to the course.
- 5. The Educational Agency shall maintain a website and agree to publish the details regarding the establishment and governance of the Educational Agency, admission, fees, courses, results, teaching and non-teaching staff, grievance redressal mechanism for students and any other information as required by Government.
- 6. The Educational Agency will agree to run only courses approved by the Government
- 7. The Educational Agency will agree to enable the Government and its representatives to check, verify and monitor the compliance of the conditions mentioned above at any time the Government so decides.
- 8. The No Objection Certificate / sanction granted shall be valid up to the end of the Academic year 2021-22 and renewable on the request of the Educational Agency and subject to the satisfactory compliance of the conditions specified herein.
- The service of the teaching and non-teaching staff of the aided stream shall not be utilized for the proposed unaided courses.

- 12. In the event of breach of any of the conditions mentioned above by the Educational Agency, the Government is authorised to withdraw the sanction without notice to the educational agency, or adjudicate the quantum of compensation which the Educational Agency is liable to pay to Government, if any, and upon such adjudication, the Educational Agency should pay to Government the amount so fixed, failing which the amount of compensation adjudicated should be recoverable under the provision of Kerala Revenue Recovery Act, 1968, as if they were public revenue due on land.






Sample of FDP (posters)










- The Mentees can share their aims, aspirations, thoughts, concerns, and feelings related to academics and social activities with their free will.


